- Selected participants will share their perspectives on conserving shared built heritage
- Topics may include proactive risk management, post-disaster recovery, adaptive reuse, and digital tools in conservation

## 4. Panel Discussion & Audience Q&A (25 minutes)

- Panelists will explore key challenges and opportunities for emerging professionals in conservation
- The discussion will highlight how early-career professionals can contribute to heritage conservation strategies
- Open Q&A session with audience participation

# 5. Closing Remarks (5 minutes)

- Summary of key insights
- Acknowledgments and discussion of potential follow-up initiatives
